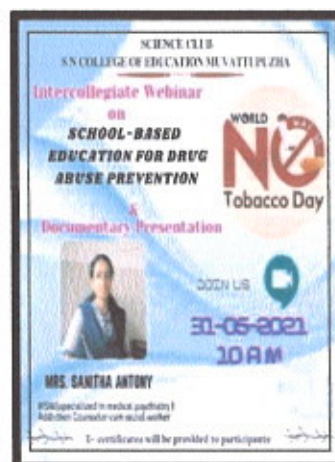
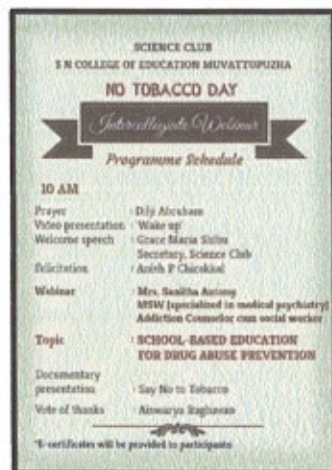

During the community living camp session, the resource person enlightened student teachers about various aspects crucial for moulding pupils into successful individuals. The discussion



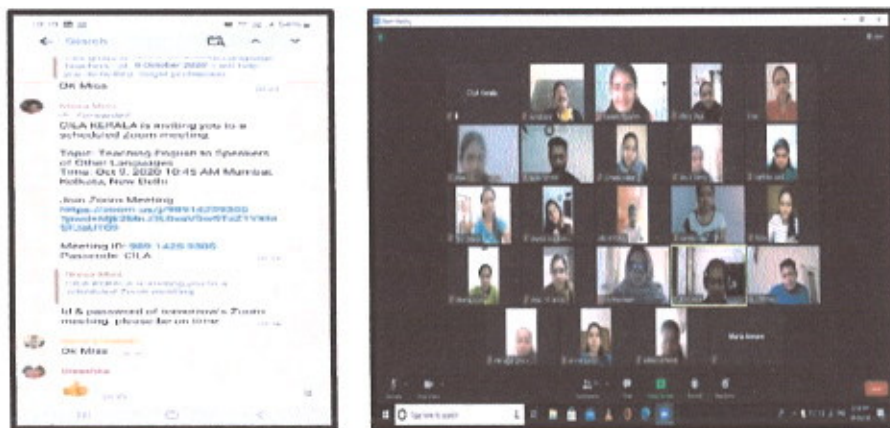
