1. CAREER AND PERSONAL COUNSELLING



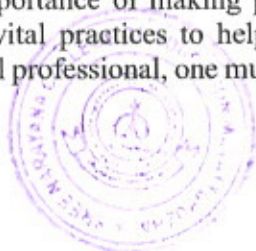
Induction Programme of B.Ed & M.Ed on 01 - 07 - 19

Session on Psychology of Men and Women by Fr Edward George on 04 - 01 - 20

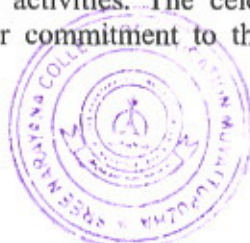

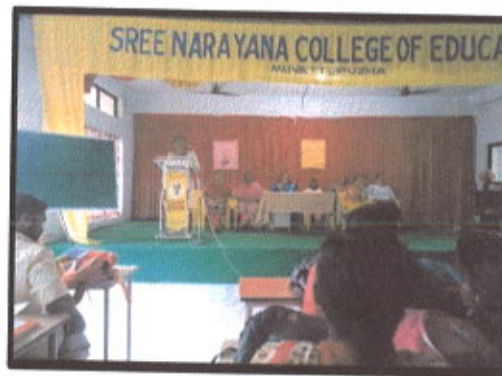


Teachers' Day & Onam Celebrations by College Union SNCE on 05 - 09 - 19

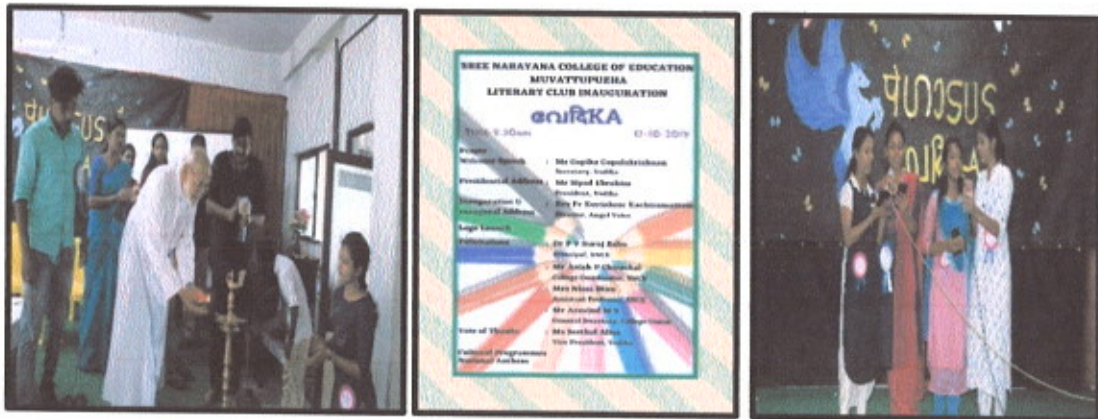


Hindi Day Celebrations by Hindi Education SNCE on 14 - 09 - 19
