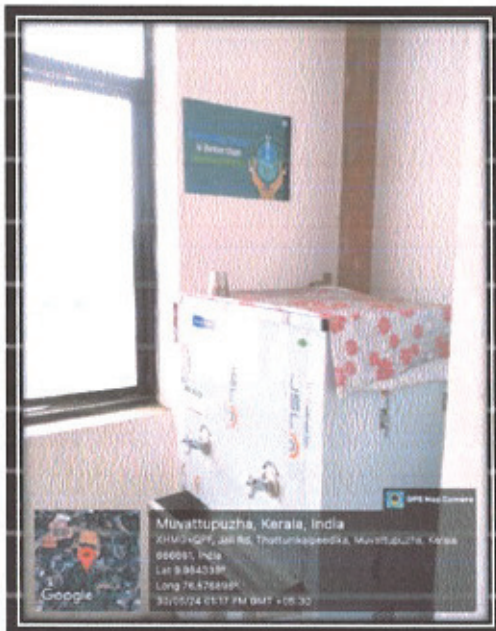

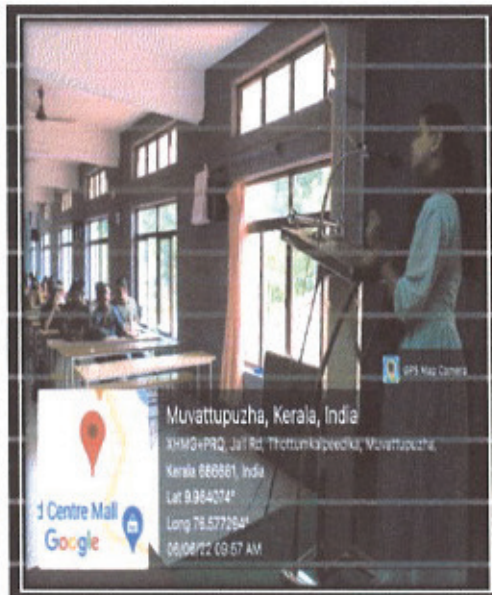
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World Environment Day Celebrations

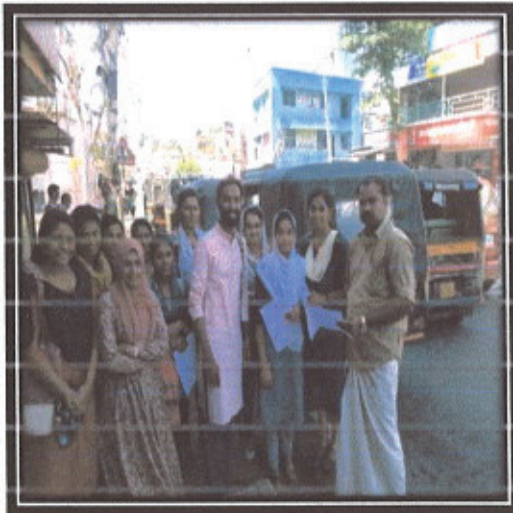

To promote awareness on green practices students distributed notices on waste disposal in the nearby houses and shops.



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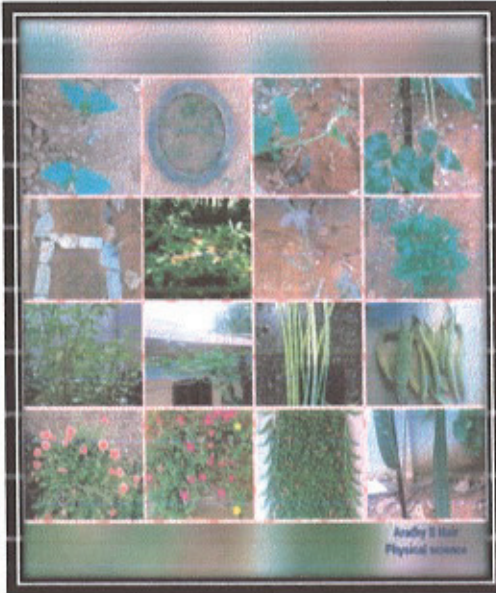

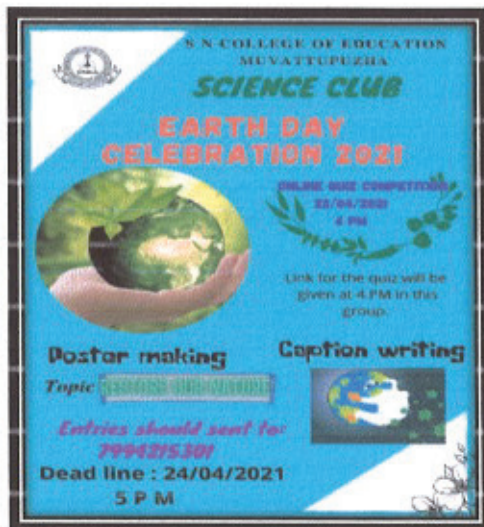

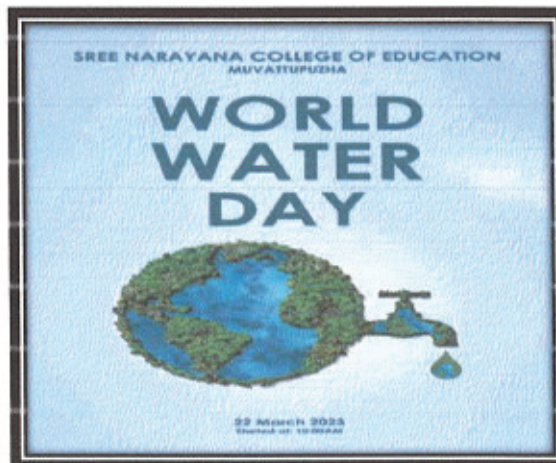
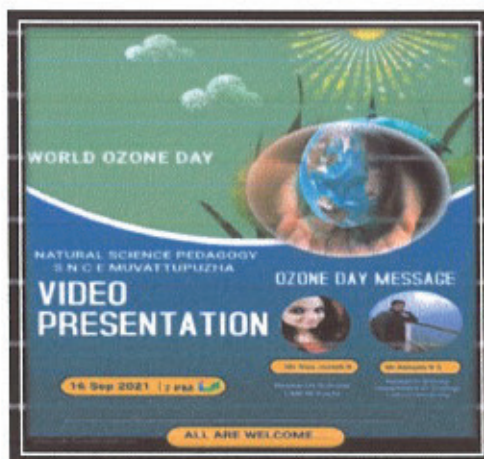

Social Extension Activity 2022: Eco Friendly Items

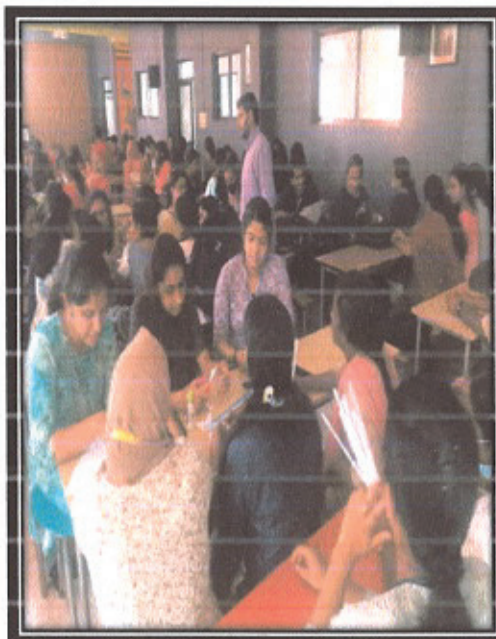

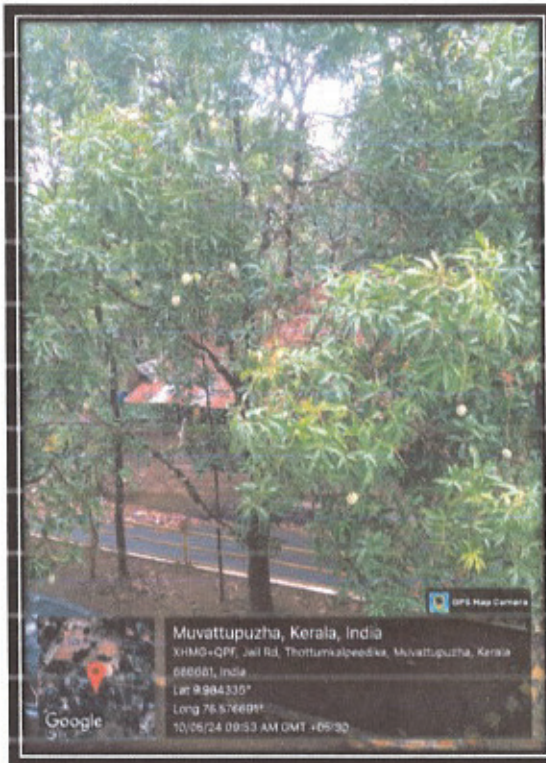

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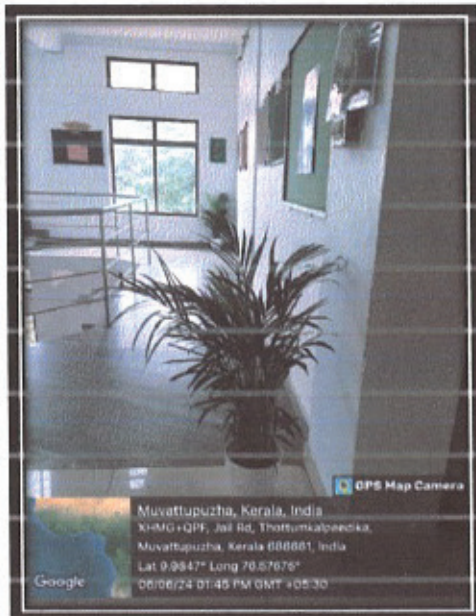

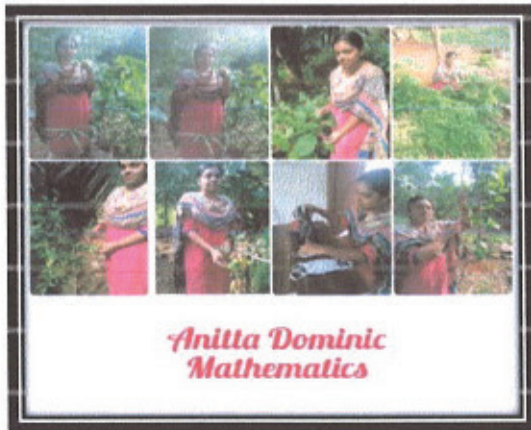
